## **DUCHESNE COUNTY – DECISION-MAKING FRAMEWORK (DMF)**

### **RELEASE TYPES:**

- 1. Release on Own Recognizance (ROR) No Conditions. No use of PRL agreement necessary.
- 2. Release with Conditions: PRL1, PRL2, PRL3, PRL4, PRL5. <u>Inmate must enter into applicable</u> written agreement or remain in jail.
- 3. Monetary Release set by court with possibility of special conditions attached. If the court specifies PRL level conditions then defendant must enter into the applicable PRL agreement in order to be released. If conditions are specified by the court but one of the PRL levels is not referenced then no PRL agreement will be used (the courts order takes its place and inmates willingness to agree is irrelevant).

# PRETRIAL RELEASE CONDITIONS:

### 1. PRL1:

- a. 1 phone contact per month (1<sup>st</sup> Monday of each month).
- b. Fee: \$20 (per month).
- c. Warrant amount for failing to call in: \$100 (per month).

## 2. PRL2:

- a. 2 phone contacts per month (1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of each month).
- b. Fee: \$30 (per month).
- c. Warrant amount for failing to call in: \$100 (per month).

# 3. PRL3:

- a. Weekly phone contacts (Every Monday).
- b. One in-person meeting with tracker per month.
- c. 4<sup>th</sup> Amendment Rights Waiver in agreement.
- d. Random drug testing (may test once per month).
- e. Fee: \$40 (per month).
- f. Warrant amount for failing to call in: \$100 (per month).

# 4. PRL4: (Current Pretrial Release Program)

- a. GPS ankle monitor.
- b. 4<sup>th</sup> Amendment Rights Waiver in agreement.
- c. Random drug testing.
- d. Fee: \$70 (per month).
- e. Warrant amount for failing to call in: \$100 (per month).

### 5. PRL5:

- a. No Bail pursuant to UCA §77-20-1, OR
- b. Monetary Bail specified by Judge with PRL4 conditions.
- c. Possible Additional Conditions set by Judge.
- d. 4<sup>th</sup> Amendment Rights Waiver in agreement.
- e. Random drug testing.
- f. Fee: \$70 (per month).
- g. Warrant amount for failing to call in: \$100 (per month).
- 6. Monetary Release and/or other court ordered conditions, which may or may not include a PRL level, on a case by case basis.
